When you think of February you think of romance. But have you ever wondered where it all originated? Well St. Valentine's Day, as we know it today, contains pieces of both Christian and ancient Roman tradition. Today, the Catholic Church recognizes at least three different saints named Valentine or Valentinus.

One legend contends that Valentine was a priest, who performed secret marriage ceremonies for young couples. This was because Emperor Claudius II had outlawed marriage to young men because he believed the single men made better soldiers than the ones with wives and families. When Valentine was discovered, it was ordered that he be put to death. Another legend, possibly intertwined with the first, suggests that Valentine himself sent the first "Valentine" card. While he was in jail he fell in love with a girl, perhaps his jailor's daughter who visited him in confinement. He sent the card and signed, 'From your Valentine.' All of these legends make Valentine's character seem sympathetic, heroic, and, most importantly, romantic.

There are two theories on why the middle of February is the date reserved. Some think it is the anniversary of Valentine's death or burial. Others think it's because the middle of February was the official start of spring in ancient Rome, and it was considered a time for purification. The middle of February is also the birds' mating season.

The oldest known Valentine is a poem written by Charles, Duke of Orleans, to his wife in 1415. It was a collection of manuscripts from the British Library. Today, approximately 85% of Valentine cards are purchased by women.
