PE Reminders

As we get back into the swing of things, we have just a few reminders from the Physical Education Department. Weather permitting; your child will be outside often for PE classes. Please dress them appropriately or make sure they have the appropriate clothes with them to wear, and make sure they are staying hydrated at home (and at school) during this heat. Also, it should be listed on your child's school supplies lists, but please make sure your student has appropriate PE tennis shoes to keep at school.
