Students in grades 1-6 will be taking the fall version of the Gates McGinitie Reading Assessment on September 28, 29, and 30. The results from these tests, along with the STAR assessments, give us a better idea of the reading level of our students. For more information on these tests, please talk with your child's classroom teacher.

Parental communication is vital part of a successful school. Please use the planners for communication as well as the website, email, phone calls, and notes. Attendance is another important part of school because new lessons are taught on a daily basis.

As we continue through this school year, I hope we all stay focused on education for our students. The students need support from home and from school. If we all work together, we will have a successful school year.

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## Polo FFA Members Attend Summer Leadership Conference

WASHINGTON, D.C.-Students from across the nation attended the 2010 Washington Leadership Conference (WLC) this summer in the nation's capital. The conference is an activity of the National FFA Organization sponsored by Monsanto as a special project of the National FFA Foundation. Alex Templeton, President, and Carlie Powers, Vice President of the Polo FFA Chapter attended the conference July 13-18, 2010.

The weeklong program helps FFA members improve their leadership skills and prepare for leadership roles in their chapters, communities and their future careers. They attended sessions on developing authentic leadership, serving their communities and participating in civic engagement. They also participate in service learning events. "We live in an increasingly competitive world," says Dr. Larry Case, National FFA Advisor and Coordinator, Agricultural and Rural Education with the U.S. Department of Education. "Tomorrow's leaders must develop skills in these areas to effectively compete. Every student leaves WLC with an advantage because it gives those young people cutting edge leadership skills and valuable insight for productive citizenship."

The National FFA Organization coordinates WLC, with the sponsorship of Monsanto, which attracts participants from across the country. This summer, more than 2,000 FFA members will attend one of the conference's seven weeklong sessions. Monsanto is dedicated to the future success of agriculture by investing more than one million dollars to the National FFA Foundation in 2010, as well as supporting a number of agricultural youth each year.

Students also increase their understanding of the nation's heritage with visits to, Arlington National Cemetery, the Jefferson, Lincoln and Roosevelt Memorials and other historic sites in Washington, D.C. A highlight of the week was a visit to the office of their local Congressman/Senator. Carlie and Alex both visited with Representative Sam Graves and were given a tour of the Capitol.

The National FFA Organization, formerly known as the Future Farmers of America, is a national youth organization of 507,763 student members - all preparing for leadership and careers in the science, business and technology

of agriculture - as part of 7,439 local FFA chapters in all 50 states, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands. The National FFA Organization changed to its present name in 1988, in recognition of the growth and diversity of agriculture and agricultural education. ### No Child Left Behind

Polo R-VII School District is required to inform parents of certain information they have the right to know, according to The No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (Public Law 107-11).

Upon request, our district is required to provide to parents in a timely manner, the following information:

" Whether the teacher has met state qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.

" Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which state qualification or licensing criteria have been waived.

" Whether your child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

" What baccalaureate degree major the teacher has and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification.

In addition to this information, school districts must also provide to each individual parent:

" Information on the achievement level of the parent's child in each of the state academic assessments as required under NCLB; and

" Timely notice that the parent's child has been assigned or has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified.

### Kindergarteners Learn the Rules of Bus Safety

Mrs. Deanna, the Bus Director of the Polo Schools, visited with the Kindergarten classes to discuss "bus safety" rules. The children discussed the rules of sitting still; using quiet inside voices and learning that the "RED" items in the bus were used only for emergencies and should NOT be touched. Mrs. Deanna taught the classes a verbal method to help remember her bus safety rules: "Put your seat ON the seat, your back TO the back, feet towards the floor, and hands IN your lap." All the students took a trip outside to board a school bus and practice the safety rules, while looking at some of the buses safety features.

### Drainage Systems Installed on Polo Softball Fields

The Polo Athletic Organization, a group of volunteers who manages the Polo ball fields for the City of Polo has been working with the Polo School District for the past two months to come up with a feasible plan that would allow them to purchase and install a drainage system on both ball fields located at Stagecoach Park. Greg Misel, Polo school board member and community volunteer was the liaison for the project. After deciding on a system that would best fit their needs Greg was in charge of ordering the materials and arranging all volunteer manpower to complete the installation. Around 50 tons of sand was delivered per field. The installation of the first drainage sytem took a little over 13 hours to complete on Field #1 and consisted of trenching and laying 1300 feet of drain tile. This was completed in one day. The drainage system has a capacity of up to 12,000 gallons of water per hour. Since the installation was completed on Field #1 we have had a couple of opportunities to see how effectively the system works. This is a tremendous improvement for the ball fields which are rented by the Polo School for the High School and Middle School softball programs. This system will greatly improve the playability of the fields throughout the year. Drainage systems were purchased for both fields and will be an estimated \$20,000 improvement for the City of Polo Ball Fields. Many are in hopes that this improvement will make the Polo ball fields a top candidate when a venue for High School District Softball play is chosen for this year. Weather permitting Field #2 will have the drainage system installed within the next couple of weeks.
