Counselor's Corner

Elementary Counseling News

The Character Word of the Month is Tolerance. During classroom guidance lessons, students in grades K-3 listened to the story *The Crayon Box that Talked* by Shane DeRolf. The message of the story encourages students to appreciate each other for both the things that make us similar to each other as well as different. Students discussed what things make us different from each other. Students in grades 4-6 discussed stereotypes to help illustrate the character word of the month. Students talked about different stereotypes they have heard and ways to "burst" stereotypes. By "bursting" stereotypes, students are demonstrating good character and embracing the character word of the month!

January 24th -28th is National No-Name Calling Week. Students in grades K-6 took part in "Taking a Stand Against Name Calling." This week is dedicated to encouraging students to put an end to name calling and other forms of bullying. During classroom guidance lessons, students discussed what is in a name and how we all have names in which we like to be called and those in which we do not like to be called. Students also talked about the differences between put-ups and put-downs. At the end of the lesson, students traced their foot on a poster showing their commitment to putting an end to name calling. High School Counseling News

Students planning to take the ACT in February the test date is February 12th. The deadline to register has past unless a student wants to try and do standby testing. If any student has missed registering for the February test and they have to take the test to meet a deadline contact Mr. Meyer about standby testing. Polo High School will be a Test Center for the April 9, ACT Test date. The regular registration deadline to apply is March 4th. Students who have access to a credit card or a debit card may apply online. Students are welcome to apply online for the ACT in the Career Center. Those students who don't have access to a credit card or debit card may register for the test by paper pencil but they will need to use a check or money order to make payment. Paper pencil ACT applications are available in the Career Center.

The Financial Aid Presentation for seniors and their parents or guardians has been rescheduled for February 10, at 7:00 p.m. in room 115 at Polo High School. The Financial Aid Director from Maple Woods Community will do the presentation. She will bring materials regarding financial aid and go over how to complete the FAFSA Application in her presentation. Any parent planning to apply for financial aid for their student should plan on attending this presentation.

Parents and seniors planning to apply for financial aid should plan to attend FAFSA Frenzy on February 13, from 2:00 - 4:00 p.m. Sites that are hosting this event are Hamilton High School, Missouri Western State University, and Maple Woods Community College. Counselors and financial aid employees from the colleges will be available to help parents and students fill out the FAFSA that afternoon. Parents will need to bring their pin numbers and students will also need to bring their pin number. Parents and students should also bring their 2010 Federal Tax Return and W2's. For those who don't have a pin number they may go to www.pin.ed.gov and apply for a pin number.

Seniors should be checking deadlines from their universities, two year colleges, and trade technical schools along with completing scholarship applications and meeting deadlines to turn those in to the scholarship agency. Students and parents should check the counselor/scholarship page on the schools website for scholarships that are available and the due dates to send in the scholarships on a frequent basis.

Grades 9-12 will be working on the Missouri Connections Program to help complete Lifetime Learning Plans and Program of Study Plans for when they graduate from high school. Students will be working on these programs in conjunction with pre-enrollment for next school year.

Randy Nadler Comes to Polo

On November 5, 2010 a world traveler named Randy Nadler told us about the interesting island called the Galapagos and the two amazing countries, Ecuador and Peru. They are all located in South America.

There are some birds that I have never seen before such as the frigate or the red, blue and masked boobies. The red ones have red feet. The blue have blue feet and the masked boobies look like they have masks on their faces.

There are many rules when hiking. Stay on the trails, don't touch any animals while on the trails, and do not leave or take anything while on the trails. They need rules so there cannot be any bad things happening such as leaving people behind or harming the environment. They made the rules don't leave anything behind on the trails because these people lived there a long time ago and left their animals there. Now there are wild pigs, dogs, and cats eating little turtle eggs. There are two different types of lava. One of them is very smooth which is called pahoehoe. The other kind of lava is really rough and is called a'a.

There are lizards on the Galapagos Island. They are mostly black and blend in with the lava. That was the only place where it lives. Some have red spots on them but scientists don't know why they are spotted like that.

Finally, the only animals the tourists are able to touch, the turtles. They can ride them and take pictures of them while they are on the turtles. The turtles are enormous. They can live to be about 200 years old. There is a turtle named Lonesome George.

On the islands if you own a boat you have to paint your name of the boat on a cliff on the Galapagos Islands. The paint you use is white. One of the names he saw on the cliff was the Chicken of the Sea.

Ecuador got its name because of where it is located; of course, it's at the equator. It's located zero degrees latitude. It is very, very hot there because the closer you are to the equator the hotter it is. There are three different pools in Ecuador. One of them is heated by a volcano and the pool is very yellow because of the sulfur. The second one is warm and kind of yellow and the third one is freezing water because the water is from the mountain's snow.

The Incas were up in the mountains because they were scared by the Spanish explorers who were going to take all of their gold. So later a guy passed it on accident and ended up calling it Machu Picchu. Machu Picchu means the "lost city" and is in Peru.

I hope you have enjoyed this very interesting story just as much as I have. I just cannot wait to see what Mr. Nadler has for us next year!
