During the skit students were reminded about important procedures during testing time such as: use only a #2 pencil, erase carefully with a white eraser, read each question carefully, restate the question, etc. Students were also reminded the importance of eating a good breakfast and getting a good night's rest before each testing day. If you are unsure of the exact dates your child will be tested on the Stanford or the MAP, please call the school and we can assist you.

On April 26, students in grades 4, 5, and 6 who scored proficient or advanced on their 2011 MAP tests will be heading to the YMCA at Chillicothe for a day of fun.

The character education word for April is "perseverance." Other words similar to patience are determination and insistence. As educators, we should always persevere and it is our hope the students also have perseverance. Mrs. Arway, elementary counselor, and classroom teachers will be focusing on perseverance in the classroom and we ask for your assistance in teaching the students the importance of the character education words. I have no doubt; students who persevere will be more productive and successful in school.

## Tackling the Test

The MAP and Stanford tests are quickly approaching. MAP testing will begin on April 12th for the 5th graders and Grades 3-8 will begin on April 17th. Students in grades K-2 will be taking the Stanford tests beginning on April 17th. With it being test taking time at Polo, here are some important things to keep in mind to help your student tackle the test.

- Attendance is very important. Please be sure that your child arrives at school on time. Testing begins promptly at 8:30 AM.
- Try to make the morning of the test a pleasant one. Do not add to your child's stress.
- Make sure your child eats a healthy breakfast.
- Remind your child about the importance of getting a good night's sleep.
- Have your child wear comfortable clothing.
- Remind students to read the directions carefully.
- Talk with your children and encourage them to do their best.
- If your child shares with you that they are anxious during the test, encourage them to take deep breaths and to think positive thoughts.
- Encourage your child to stay positive while taking the test. Instead of thinking "I can't do this" think "I can do this." Staying positive will help children to remain calm throughout taking the test.
- Send your child to school with some words of encouragement and make sure he/she is relaxed, confident and positive.

## Polo girls 2nd place in Districts

Both Polo teams played in Albany in the District 16 Basketball Tournament. Polo girls had one thing on their minds and that was a rematch with the Maysville Wolverines, the team that defeated them last year during Districts. Senior Jonna Stottlemyre led her team to that rematch on Thursday night as she poured in 18 points against the Tarkio Indians. Senior Kadee Phillips' tough, in your face defense along with Sammie Copeland's 16 points helped ensure that trip back to the Championship for the Polo Lady Panthers against the Indians. Earlier in the week, Polo tromped Albany in their first District match up 64-27. Sammie Copeland led in points that game with 17, Kadee Phillips 8, Snodgrass 8 (one - 3 pointer), Tabitha Poje 8 (one - 3 pointer) Cati Boruch 8 (one - 3 pointer), Missy Cawthon 6, Jonna Stottlemyre one 3 pointer, Sid Copeland 2, Daniel Allen 2 & Adriana Segar 2.

Thursday evening Polo took on the 3rd ceded Tarkio Indians. Although senior Jonna Stottlemyre made several successful drives to the hole and made the shot to lead her team with a game high of 18 points, the game remained close. Early in the fourth quarter, senior Kadee Phillips snatched a steal, drove to the basket and made the layup. The Polo team rallied with additional steals from Phillips and Stottlemyre and pulled ahead ending the game with the win 57-41. Leading her team was senior Jonna Stottlemyre 18 (one - 3 pointer), Sammie Copeland with 16, Sidney Copeland 7 (one - 3 pointer), Tabitha Poje 6 (two - 3 pointers), Kadee Phillips 5, Avery Snodgrass 5 (one - 3 pointer). During this game, sophomore Tabitha Poje broke the Polo school record for the most 3 pointers made in one season, 48. Poje ended the year with 50 total.

With this victory over the Indians, Polo advanced to the Championship game on Saturday night for the second year in a row. It was a rematch between Polo and Maysville. Last year, the Lady Panthers fell to Maysville who had the home court advantage by 10 points. It was the first time a Polo girls team had made it to a Championship in 13 years. Polo was ready for the battle. A large crowd showed up to support the Lady Panthers in their fight to capture the title of District Champions. Polo got off to a slow start with Maysville outscoring them in the first quarter at one time 14-2. Although the team seemed to shake the jitters, turnovers and missed shots under the basket remained enemies for the Polo Lady Panthers throughout the game. Maysville capitalized on them and snatched the Championship from Polo once again by only 3 points with a final score of 47-44. The Polo team played hard and fought right up to the final buzzer. Freshman Sidney Copeland led her team in points with 16, Sammie Copeland 9, Avery Snodgrass 6, Jonna Stottlemyre 5 (one - 3 pointer), Tabitha Poje 5 (one - 3 pointer), Kadee Phillips 3. The Polo team will be losing seniors Jonna Stottlemyre and Kadee Phillips. Polo girls received 2nd place for the second year in a row to the Maysville team. The Polo girls season was a successful one with a final record of 17 wins and 9 losses. They received 5th in conference play.

Gallatin boys team knocked the Polo boys out in a nail biter as they fell short to Gallatin with a three point shot at the buzzer late Wednesday night. The boys played Tarkio on Monday night and smashed the Indians 70-39. Leading in points was Dalton Mills with 19 (one - 3 pointer, Jack Pile 18, Zach Freeman 13, Toby Poje 8, Ashton Shelton 7, Justin Hazelman 3 (one - 3 pointer) & Dylan Parker with 2. Wednesday night the Panthers were faced with playing the Gallatin Bulldogs, who had beat them in regular season play by only 5 points. Although Polo led most of the game by 10 points, it came down to the final second that mattered most. With 2.0 seconds on the clock, Polo leading by 2 points and one inbounds pass, a couple of dribbles, a three point shot was thrown up at the buzzer, bounced off the backboard and went in. The Bulldogs beat the Panthers 50-49. Leading the Panthers was Shelton with 18, Pile 10, Mills 7 (one - 3 pointer), Poje & Freeman with 4 each, Hazelman and Dillon James both with one 3 pointer. The Polo team will be losing 5 seniors, Ashton Shelton, Toby Poje, Austin Bowley, Dillon James and Justin Hazelman. The team finished 5th in the conference. The Panthers had a great season with a winning record of 18 wins - 9 losses that were all close games.

## Lady Softball Panthers Receive All-State Academic Awards

The Missouri Fast Pitch Coach Association released the Academic All-State for high school softball. Polo received 4 members. They are 1st team member Juniors, Sammie Jo Copeland and Avery Snodgrass; second team members are freshmen Mattie Curp and Jessica Farmer. In order to be selected to the Academic All State team, you must have a cumulative GPA of 3.88 or better to be a first team winner or a 3.75 or higher to be a second team member.

The 2011 Polo Softball team's hard work in classroom qualified the entire team to be an Academic All State team by having a team cumulative GPA of 3.4! This is the 3rd year in a row for the Polo softball team to achieve this honor.

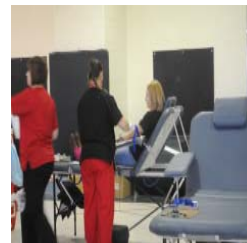
