Polo hosted the Maysville Wolverines Saturday, September 29, for their Homecoming game. Polo scored their first of 8 touchdowns within 2 minutes of the start of the game. The halftime score was Polo 38 - Maysville 6. Coach Kyle Ross commented, "

We had the same starting offensive line for the third week in a row and it really showed. Brady McCaskey, Justin Hicks, Mason Misel, Jacob Hicks, and Houston Stone are really starting to gel up front. Also we have the luxury of a "6th starter" in Dylan Fry. Dylan is extremely valuable because he can play either guard or tackle on both sides of the ball and we don't miss a beat (Dylan is a defensive starter). We ran the ball 57 times for 486 yards and 8 td's and were 4 of 5 passing for 50 yds and 1 interception on Saturday. Defensively we played extremely well in the 1st half limiting an offensively talented Maysville team to 1 score." Offensively for Polo Zach Freeman had 21 carries for 218 yards and 4 touchdowns, Jonathan Shelton had 9 carries for 120 yards total. Polo's fullbacks combined (Daniel Boruch, Wiley Martin & Dakota McGinley) for 15 carries for 106 yards and 4 touchdowns. Defensively Seniors Justin Hicks & Dalton Mills led with 9 tackles and Jonathan Shelton had 5 tackles, 1 recovered fumble, 2 interceptions and 2 pass deflections.
