Where did summer go? In just a few weeks we will begin the 2012-2013 school year! I am so excited to begin a new school year and I hope the children are anxious to be back in school. Tentative class lists for the 2012-2013 school year are included in this edition. If your child is not listed, we apologize and ask for you to please call the school.

I would like to welcome our new staff members to Polo! Laney Cox and Elizabeth Lasman will be our new second grade teachers. Mrs. Cox is from Braymer and Miss Lasman comes from the Columbia area. Miss Lasman will also be the middle school basketball coach for the girls. Danielle Green, from Richmond, was hired as a permanent substitute. When not substituting in a classroom, Miss Green will be working with our at-risk students. Miss Green assisted with our recent summer school program and she will also be the Varsity Basketball Cheerleading sponsor. Mrs. Fran Esry, formerly a second grade teacher, has taken the position of Title I Reading teacher. Mrs. Gretchen Brashear will join our preschool staff as the para-professional and Mrs. Jamy Aubrey will be our PAT teacher and coordinator. I would also like to welcome Mr. Jonathan Pickrell as the middle school math teacher.

The Common Core State Standards will be a main focus at Polo R-VII School District this year. These standards are similar to the Grade Level Expectations; however, the expectations have increased tremendously at each grade level. With this in mind, student accountability and student expectations will be greater than ever and we are entrusting parents to help with these increased expectations. Grade level policies will remain implemented in regard to homework assignments, late work, and names on paper. Please note these policies may not affect all grade levels in the elementary. The elementary will be learning about the "Seven Habits for Happy Kids" (through our classroom guidance sessions). We will also continue having monthly character education focus words. These words will be listed on the hallway bulletin board and should be included in my monthly news articles. Teachers and counselors will implement character education into the classrooms on a daily basis. As we discuss character education, we will also continue to emphasize the importance of daily attendance. Students and staff will be monitoring their classroom attendance daily and will be having monthly competitions to see who can have the best attendance. The goal of Polo R-VII School District is to have 96% daily attendance. Research shows attendance is directly related to student performance and since students are "our" focus, we need them here so they can learn.

"Show Your Pride, Polo, America" will be the theme of the elementary Panther Pride board. Students demonstrating exemplary behavior (respect, sharing, kindness, etc) will be acknowledged by having their name displayed on the board.

Open House will be held on Monday, August 13, from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. Please mark your calendar and make every effort to attend open house so you will be able to meet your child's teacher. Bus transportation information will be available at open house, so be sure to stop by the office for any questions that you might have.

Polo Athletes Break Two School Records at State

The Polo girls placed 13th as a team out of 132 schools in the State of Missouri. Two school records were broken; Avery Snodgrass in the 300 m Hurdle finals (48.10), which she had previously broken this year, and the 4 x 400 m Relay team of Avery Snodgrass, Ashley Adams, Cati Boruch, and Adriana Segar (4:14.47) in the preliminaries. Medalists include: 300 m Hurdles - Avery Snodgrass (4th Place - 48.10); 4 x 200 m Relay - Avery Snodgrass, Cati Boruch, Ashley Adams, Adriana Segar (6th Place - 1:53.03); 4 x 400 m Relay - Avery Snodgrass, Ashley Adams, Cati Boruch, Adriana Segar (5th Place - 4:17.08), Discus - Sammie Jo Copeland (4th Place - 111'10"); Shot Put - Sammie Jo Copeland (6th Place - 34'9") and Sidney Copeland (8th Place - 34'5.25"). Other qualifiers who competed include Amber Adams in the 100 m Hurdles, Austin Bowley in the 1600 m Run, and the 4 x 100 m Relay team of Megan Knutter, Amber Adams, Avery Snodgrass, and Ashley Adams. Alternate Monica Fickess also accompanied the team.

From the Desk of the High School Principal

Welcome back to school PANTHERS! I hope that each one of you had an outstanding summer are ready to accept the challenges that will come before you in the 2012-13 school year. Last year was fast paced and full of excitement here in Polo. Academically we achieved "Distinction in Performance" for the 3rd time in four years. We had District champion teams and State Champion individuals in sports activities as well as in academic competition. I believe that those things truly show how well rounded an individual that the Polo R7 School District and community is producing. Coming off of a good year gives us a great place to begin the 2012-13 year from. We must continue to build off of our past triumphs and learn from our past setbacks in order to set and reach higher goals.

We are living in an ever changing political world and education is at the forefront of several decisions at the local, state, and national level. In Missouri we will be going through a new revamped accreditation process known as MSIP 5. Each day it seems that the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education is sending out an update to the new system. The good news is that the Polo R7 School District has been working towards this change for the past several years and already has some of the new systems in place. Over the summer the state of Missouri received a waiver from the "No Child Left Behind Act". With the approval of the waiver, Missouri will now be able to focus on its own state-developed educational standards and assisting schools in meeting those standards to successfully prepare students for the future. This waiver does include provisions for more rigorous academic standards and ambitious, but achievable accountability measures. Some of these measures tie into the new MSIP 5 guides. These measures include individual attendance, MAP/EOC scores, ACT scores, upper level classes offered/attended, and increased testing through the Vocational and Agricultural class settings.

In order to stay competitive we will need everyone's help in the matter. The Polo R7 School District will work diligently to successfully educate our students, however the normal school day will not provide enough time for the ever increasing demands. There is an old saying that "it takes a village to raise a child" and I am not sure that it has ever been more true. We need for all people that are involved in the lives of our students to become "stakeholders" in their future. Involvement can be as simple as helping with math homework or having a meaningful conversation at the dinner table about the events of the day. Research indicates that students who have people involved in their educational process consistently get better grades and have higher test scores.

PUBLIC RELEASE

Polo R-VII announced its revised free and reduced price policy for school children unable to pay the full price of meals served in schools under the National School Lunch Program and the School Breakfast Program.

Local education officials have adopted the following family-size income criteria for determining eligibility:

Children from families whose current income is at or below those shown are eligible for free or reduced price meals. Applications are available at the school office. To apply, fill out a Free and Reduced Price School Meals Family Application and return it to the school. The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may be submitted any time during the school year. A complete application is required as a condition of eligibility. A complete application includes: (1) household income from all sources or Food Stamp/Temporary Assistance case number, (2) names of all household members, and (3) the signature and last four digits of social security number or indication of no social security number of adult household member signing the application. School officials may verify current income at any time during the school year.

Foster children may be eligible regardless of the income of the household with whom they reside.

If a family member becomes unemployed or if family size changes, the family should contact the school to file a new application. Such changes may make the children of the family eligible for these benefits.

Under the provisions of the policy, the **Building Principal** will review the applications and determine eligibility. If a parent is dissatisfied with the ruling of the determining official, they may wish to discuss the decision with the hearing official on an informal basis or he may make a request either orally or in writing to the **Superintendent**.

Hearing procedures are outlined in the policy. A complete copy of the policy is on file in each school and in the central office where any interested party may review it.

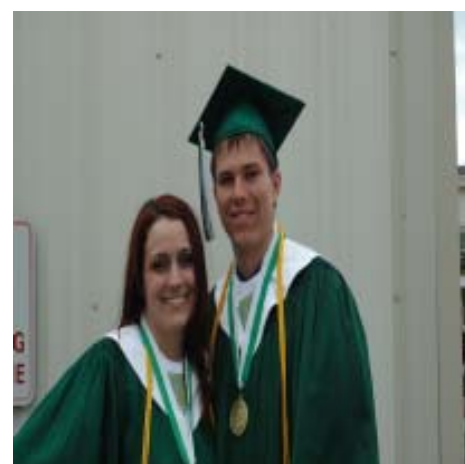
